

Our Association's Riding Tips



1. Do not travel on roads or trails that are very wet and muddy which will leave tracks.
2. Ride with a buddy and wait for the person behind you to catch up with you when you come to an intersection.
3. Remember, riders are responsible for the person behind them. When the road makes a “T” or a “Y” (splits), WAIT until they catch up with you or until they at least acknowledge your direction.
4. Suggest wearing your helmet and goggles! Leave sandals in your vehicle and wear boot-type shoes.
5. Take plenty of water while riding especially, during the summer.
6. Stop every four miles or so to rest and enjoy the scenery, take photos, etc.
7. Offer assistance to the beginner riders. Explain how to ride their ATV safely in unusual terrain, such as side hills, gullies, washes, etc.
